The Rev. Charles M. Jones, pastor. of the Chapel Hill Prerbyterian church, last night dedined official comment upon Sunday's racial incident, in which he has become the controversial central Agure, but promised to relense statement elarifylare the situation late todhy.
Back from an oweraight trip to Greenshore, the Rev, Mr. Fohes spest most of yesterday afternoon and last night conferring with plannera on a projected addition to his sharch. He ssid he preferred to say bothing on the racinl matter until he lad had time to think the mstter through and prepare a formal statement.
