SPOTLIGHT: LOCAL RADIO BENEFIT WEEKEND



For years, radio stations have supported musicians, but this weekend the tables have turned, and local musicians are coming together to lend their talents to support two local radio stations.  
This Friday and Saturday night at Cat's Cradle, a menagerie of bands will gather for a benefit for UNC's student radio station, WXYC, and Car-rboro community radio station WCOM.  
On the schedule for Friday night is a Bluegrass Jam with local favorites Big Fat Gap and Mason's Apron. The show bill also notes additional "friends," so get ready for a stage filled with talent and local celebrities.  
Saturday night's lineup is stacked with Free Electric State, Lizzy Ross, Wylie Hunter & The Cazadores, John Howie Jr. and the Rosewood Bluff and New Town Drunks.  
Tickets are a suggested donation of \$5 per night, or you can opt for a weekend pass for \$8. Doors open at 8 p.m. and the shows start at 8:30 each night.

"We are all here with hearts and minds alike," said Terrence Foushee, a member of the Chapel Hill-Carrboro NAACP. "Use the energy we create here to push yourself forward to change in 2012."  
Using King as an inspiration and his words as motivation, pre-senters at the rally, representing a variety of organizations includ-ing the Chapel Hill-Carrboro NAACP and Occupy Chapel Hill, spoke of educational inequal-ity, fighting against voter ID laws and keeping President Barack Obama in the White House.  
Matt Hughes, chairman of the Orange County Democratic Party, used his time at the micro-phone to talk primarily about po-litical matters, including the need

for citizens to get out and vote.  
"A lot of us voted for change in 2008, but some of us must have fallen asleep and forgotten to vote in 2010 to sustain that change," Hughes said.  
Not all speakers addressed politics. Kevin Daniels, president of the Fredrick Douglass Founda-tion of North Carolina, urged attendees to remember King as a preacher as well as an activist.  
"What a lot of people have done is reduced Rev. Martin Lu-ther King to a political agenda, which is sad, because he was bigger than that," Daniels said.  
Daniels reminded attend-ees that King worked with both Republicans and Democrats to instigate change, and that much like not judging someone by the color of their skin, one mustn't be judged by what political party they affiliate themselves with.  
"Above all, our call is justice,"

Sacrificial Poets member CJ Suitt said as the crowd prepared to take to the streets for a march to the First Baptist Church on North Robertson Street for a service.  
Rally-goers eagerly took to the pavement of Franklin Street, sing-ing "Marching up to Freedom Land" and "We Shall Overcome," and as their bodies found warmth, their voices grew louder, chanting "Fired up and ready to go."  
The diverse crowd then poured into the church, packing the pews, as regular churchgoers sat beside the non-religious and social activ-ists shared space with police chiefs and local and state politicians.  
The crowd was greeted by a powerful speech from Michelle Laws, the president emeritus of the Chapel Hill-Carrboro NAACP.  
"We are here to recommit our-selves to the fight for social justice," Laws told the crowd in a strong and amplified voice. "Welcome to

the struggle newcomers; welcome to the fight."  
The keynote speaker for the day was state Rep. Larry D. Hall, who spoke about poverty, the North-side community and education.  
Hall referenced King's vision to end poverty for all races, but lamented the fact that while we have more resources to fight pov-erty today than in King's time, the epidemic is worse now than then.  
Hall also talked about the need for citizens to make certain the people they elected to represent them are acting in accordance with the needs of the community, saying, "I am an elected official, but you are the leaders."  
"This is the first day we can be what we want to be," Hall said, encouraging those assembled to use this day to set the tone for their year.  
"We all can be great because we all can serve."

team) has a buzzer and whoever buzzes in first answers. For every correct answer, the team gets a chance to answer three bonus questions for additional points.  
Questions cover most ac-ademic subjects and occasionally pop culture, which Ilieve says his team doesn't do as well on.  
While many questions are related to information students learn in class, others are more obscure and can be impossible to prepare for.  
To study, Ilieve said, "We go on Wikipedia and jump from page to page reading."  
The 15-member Jaguar team typically goes to five tourna-ments a year but will not be competing this weekend since it is the hosting team.

The team is in its second year and qualified for nationals last year but was unable to attend because of funding. This year, money raised from the Carrboro Cup through admission fees will help the Jaguars collect the funds necessary for nationals if they qualify.  
Ilieve, who is a senior, said he is looking forward to seeing both his team and the Carrboro Cup continue after he graduates.  
"Quiz bowl is a place for peo-ple who are academically mo-tivated outside the classroom," Ilieve said, adding that there aren't many places for those stu-dents. "I hope I have established quiz bowl as one of the root so-cieties in Carrboro and that it continues after I leave."
