Skull-bowls discovered

FROM STAFF AND WIRE REPORTS

Skeletal remains unearthed in southwest England suggest ancient Britons used human skulls as bowls.

The skulls were fashioned in such a meticulous manner that being used to hold liquid is the only reasonable explanation, scientists said.

The 14,700-year-old braincases, discovered in Somerset, were probably used as part of a ritual, they said.
