

In many ways, I felt I was grown up at age 10. In spite of that background, I went to college and grad school. I was an overachiever. I played tennis and basketball. I received swimming and football scholarships.

I did my overachieving to get myself out of a devilish environment I knew would tear me down. It was an escape, but that escape provided me with an above-average success in life. I was a recreational therapist for 36 years before I retired. But during that time, I didn't know how to deal with the stress of my job. As a result,

I began to focus on alcohol. I've been in and out of several recovery programs, but no program is like the Victory program here at the Durham Rescue Mission.

The Christian journey is a process for me

Here at the Mission, I'm developing a solid relationship with Christ. Every day I feel my Christian walk is another step on a wonderful journey. I have a hunger for God, and the void I once felt is now being filled with the person of Jesus Christ. But it's a process, and I still have a long way to go. The good news is I know what I need and *I know where to get it*. God is providing me with all my answers. I just need to remember to make sure I continue to give Him full control of my life. 


Remember Others This Christmas
