To be honest, we were sad as we consider Susan as the glue that holds everything together. Her leadership makes events like MUMFEST appear effortlessly, as everything just falls into place.

When we met Susan five years ago, we felt her graceful, but commanding presence. She has given her heart to the City of New Bern for the past three decades and was instrumental in changing Downtown New Bern from a rundown town to a flourishing small city!

When I asked Susan to name one of her favorite projects, she didn't hesitate when she said, "Every project is". No matter how small or large the task, she won't stop until every one of them is accomplished. Susan welcomes any hurdles that come her way and she manages to surpass them time and time again.

Her ambitious and determined spirit has helped her forever change Downtown New Bern to a beautiful tourist destination.

Some people may not understand how rejuvenating the Downtown directly impacts the economic development of the Greater New Bern area. Susan summed it up when she said, "We all agree, shopping centers play an important role in the economy and meet a range of customer needs, but to believe they take the place of the "city center, village square" or heart of the community is to fail to understand the nature and importance of downtown and their value. In a successful downtown there is a sense of community ownership, "it is our downtown." It is home to the institutional leadership of the community, local government, financial institutions, law firms and others. It serves as the city center offering a range of cultural activities, museums, shops, parks, and historic attractions...a place of diversity and interaction among the entire community and most importantly, as a barometer on the economic health of the community."

Many people moved here because it has such a beautiful small town atmosphere with large events and activities you'd find in a big city. We have the best of both worlds!

With the help from Danielle Glynn, the Swiss Bear Board, and numerous volunteers, Susan's efforts brought major attractions to New Bern's Annual MUMFEST and other major projects over the years.

Here's only a fraction of the initiatives that Susan has either directed or has been involved in:

- Improvements to the Richard Dobb Spaight grave site off Madam Moore's Lane. She said, "As a history major, I was excited that we had the grave site of one of the signers of the Constitution here".
- The F-11 Grumman Fighter Jet Project off Hwy 70. Susan said, "The City not only has a new attraction, but it was given to us as a gesture of friendship from MCAS Cherry Point. It's also an example of the Community coming together".
- 29 years as Director of the Annual MUMFEST. It's been estimated that the festival reached over 100,000 visitors. Think about the positive economic impact the festival makes for local businesses and non-profits.
- Seafair: World's First Mobile Mega Yacht Art Venue to visit New Bern.
- Not afraid to try new technology, she became a "blogger" and recounted Swiss Bear's history and upcoming events on Swiss Bear's Blog. She's also a contributing author for the New Bern Sun Journal.
- Instrumental in spearheading the Community Rally to save the Downtown Post Office.
- Redevelopment of Union Point Park and Council Bluff Green.
- Spider Lily Sculpture Project; 300th Commemorative Plate; Sunrise Business Updates; Ship Hauling Machine Restoration; and Main Street USA Success Story.

She's very humble and believes it takes a community to make things happen. She was quoted as being "very appreciative of having the honor and good fortune to work for Swiss Bear and be part of an organization whose accomplishments are tangible, measurable, and have enhanced the quality of life for many citizens"

Although we will miss stopping by to see Susan, her footprints will forever remain on the streets of Downtown. We are happy for Susan and wish her the best in her future endeavors. With Susan's passion for our town, I'm sure she will continue to do terrific work throughout our community.



Boating, fishing, paddling, hunting, golfing, biking, hiking, bird watching, photography, camping, and tennis are only a few of many outdoor recreation opportunities in New Bern, NC!

Nestled between the Neuse and Trent Rivers in Eastern North Carolina, New Bern is a haven for boaters, fishermen, and water sport fanatics. From large Marina's to off the path boat ramps, you'll find them here: <a href="https://www.ncwildlife.org">www.ncwildlife.org</a>.

Fishing is plentiful! Some of the water is brackish so you can catch both salt water and fresh water fish - you may need both licenses. For a unique outdoor experience, call <a href="Spec-Fever Fishing Guide Services">Spec Fever Fishing Guide Services</a> (249-1520). Join the <a href="Anglers Anonymous Fishing Club">Anonymous Fishing Club</a> (919-757-5715). Custom Marine Inc, 2401 Hwy 70 E (638-5422) also has boating and fishing equipment.

Do you prefer paddling? Contact the Neuse Riverkeepers (637-7972) and/or the Twin Rivers Paddle Club (636-6606) for paddle trail maps and details about boating and fishing on the Neuse and Trent Rivers along with their tributaries. You can also rent kayaks, stand up paddleboards, bikes, and take tours with the Bear Town Adventure Co. (288-5823). Stand Up Outfitters also rents SUPs (514-0404).

Campers have many choices. Stay at New Bern's KOA, located on Hwy 17 N in Bridgeton (800-562-3341). Visit Flanner's Beach Campground or Neuse River Campground which are run by the Croatan National Forest. Brice's Creek also has a small primitive campground.

Join cyclists at Flythe's Bike Shop, 2411 Trent Rd, as Flythe's leads bike rides around town (638-1544). You can also rent bike's from them at the Galley Stores, 300 E. Front St. Atomic Cycles also leads rides around town. Visit them at 504 S. Front St. (633-2242).

Attention golf lovers! #### Enjoy a Walk in the Croatan



There's nothing like walking in the woods before dawn breaks knowing that the forest will come alive as the sun rises. Although navigating the woods in the dark has its challenges and hearing some strange noises may be intimidating, it's well worth it.

As daybreak peeks thru the trees, you hear the first signs of life with a turkey gobbling or a crow cawing. Then chipmunks and squirrels appear. As you sit leaning again a tree, a deer walks right in front of you and if you're still, it doesn't even know you're there.

It's also a sanctuary for black bear, quail, coyote, beaver, porcupine, bobcat, American alligator, bald eagle, red-tailed hawk, and other wildlife.

This is a special time for me as any daily worries escape my mind and at that moment, I'm at peace with nature.

Known as a "Nature Lover's Paradise", it has exotic plants like the Venus flytrap, making it the only National Forest with the largest carnivorous plant population. Most of my friends prefer to bike, kayak, fish, or do other outdoor activities. You can do all of them in the <u>Croatan National Forest</u>.

If you've never been in the Croatan, I recommend stopping by the Ranger Station off Hwy 70 E, 141 E. Fisher Ave (638-5628) and get a map as the roads aren't paved or marked with street signs. Don't let that prevent you from enjoying over 160,000 acres of beautiful land. I've spent hundreds of hours in the Croatan and have never been lost driving on the roads (I don't use a GPS).

If you decide to enter the woods and have never been, the terrain isn't treacherous, but some of the foliage can be unrelenting as you try to make your way thru thick overgrowth and swamplands. GPS's can't always be relied on so it's vital to bring a compass as a backup.

When you see footpaths marked by white gates, they will lead you to food plots. Always tell someone where you'll be hiking/hunting. Park on the side of the road where you enter, so the Ranger can find you...just in case you get lost.






