FVPC's mission is to prevent and end family violence in Orange County through direct services and community education. Services offered include a 24-hour hotline, crisis counseling, safety planning, support groups, emotional

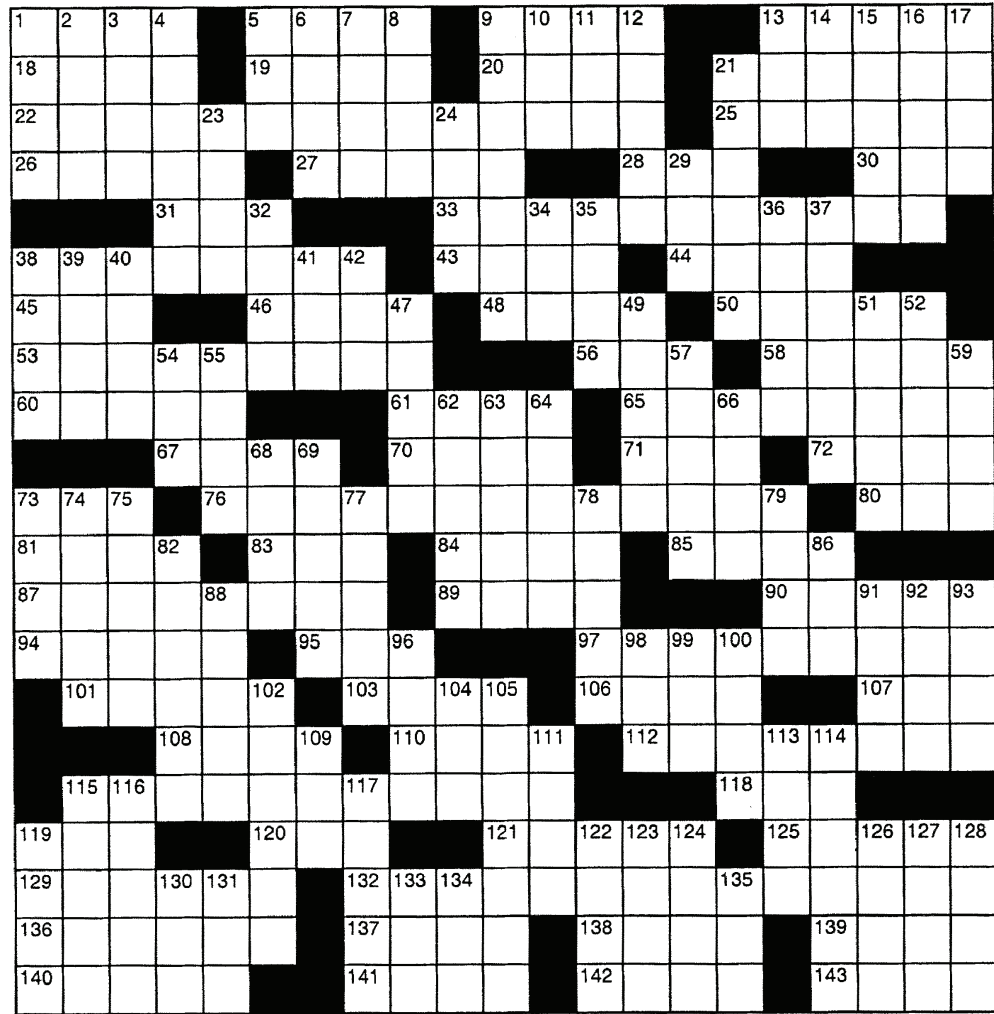
