Interim Tribal Administrator's News

In the absence of a paid administrator we have secured insurance for all the tribal property therefore, reducing our liability if an incident does occur. We are reviving our WIOA program to serve more youth this summer. Our citizens concerns about the phone system have been addressed. A contract has been secured that will provide a high-quality phone system and will reduce cost. The employee's will have some of the best internet service in the area to better serve our citizens.

I would like to commend our staff and volunteers for another great powwow as they did an outstanding job. If you ever had doubt, we had the best fry bread around, we have the proof as our volunteers sold over six thousand dollars of fry bread in two days. A big thank you to these volunteers as well.

Welcome aboard, Kathy Harris, our new Part-Time Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act Director. The Tribal WIOA Program provides classroom training assistance, work experience, and job search and placement assistance services to eligible American Indian clients. The ultimate goal of our assistance and services is to: (1) increase academics, occupational, and literacy skills among the American Indian population; (2) increase American Indian workers' abilities to be competitive in the workforce, thus helping them to achieve personal and economic self-sufficiency, and; (3) to promote the social and economic development in North Carolina Indian communities. We are working closely with Debra James who is the WIOA Student Incentive Program Coordinator to provide services for youth from age 16-24 who are high school dropouts or have a criminal conviction. To determine eligibility for the commission's WIOA Section 166 program, a program application must be completed and submitted to one of our WIOA offices. The WIOA Program office hours are from 8 a.m.- 5 p.m. Monday, Wednesday and Friday at the Chief W.R. Richardson Tribal Government Complex.

Haliwa-Saponi Summer Legacy Camp Interns Needed

The Haliwa-Saponi Tribe's Legacy Project will have its 2nd Annual Haliwa-Saponi Summer Legacy Camp for students on July 22-23, 2019. Camp will serve participant's 13 to 18 years old. The first two days will be held at the Rev. C.H. Richardson Building from 9:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. and the final two days of activities will be held off site. The tribe will provide participants with a light breakfast, lunch and an afternoon snack. Students will learn the traditional ways of our people through language, crafts, leadership, history, stories and field trips! The camp will help with leadership skills and help students prepare for the future! We are seeking **two interns**, one male and one female to assist with the Haliwa-Saponi Legacy Camp. Interns will be paid \$300 each for the four-day camp and must be 19-21 years of age and attending a 2 or 4 year college. Applications can be picked up and returned to the Chief W.R. elections will be held at the Chief W.R. Richardson Tribal Complex Government Complex. The polls will open at 7:00 a.m. and will close at 7:00 p.m. You must be an enrolled tribal member and 16 and older to vote. Please turn off your cell phones when you enter the building. Any markings other than selections will be considered a defaced ballot and will not be counted. No campaigning will be allowed on the sidewalk, parking lot, or lawn adjacent to the building. Campaigning is allowed only on the lawn opposite the parking lot. No pets allowed unless it's a service animal. Curbside assistance is available for handicapped and disabled. 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Tutelo-Saponi Language

In the Tutelo-Saponi Language, *verbs*, or the class of words that indicate the occurrence or performance of an action or state or condition, form the basis of the language. The present, past, future, and current actions are encoded in the verb.

The Tutelo-Saponi verb is broken into two different types of verbs, patient (or stative) and active, each having its own type of markers, or pronouns.

Patient (Stative) Pronouns – Patient pronouns indicate that the action is not instigated by the speaker or is the speaker's state. (*This is not always the case, examples will be given later).

Actor or Active Verbs – Events are performed, effected, and instigated by the participant.
