

Film follows buddies' journey



ChathamArts' Sustainable Cinema Series starts the new year off with a Jan. 29 screening of the documentary Looking for Ms. Locklear. Lillington-based filmmakers Rhett McLaughlin and Link Neal will be on hand for a post-film discussion.

The show begins at 7 p.m. in the Fearrington Village Barn on U.S. 15-501 in Chatham County, midway between Pittsboro and Chapel Hill. Special event admission is \$10 at the door or online at chathamarts.org

Rhett and Link have been friends since meeting in Ms. Locklear's first-grade classroom in Buies Creek. During the summer of 2006, they decided to search for her by relying solely on face-to-face contacts. Looking for *Ms. Locklear* chronicles that journey.

Locklear won the 2008 Southern Lens Award from South Carolina Public Television and the Audience Award at the Secret City and Ace film festivals.

Actor and producer Danny Glover will give the 29th annual Martin Luther King Jr. Memorial Lecture on Jan. 21 at UNC. The free public talk will be at 7:30 p.m. in Memorial Hall, preceded by a candlelight vigil starting at 6:30 p.m. at the Old Well on Cameron Avenue. The vigil is intended as a time for reflection on King's messages.

The events are part of the 29th annual Martin Luther King Jr. Birthday Celebration, Jan. 17-22, which also will include a film and oratorical contest, a march down Franklin Street and a talk by Cleve Jones, creator of the AIDS quilt. Multiple organizations across

Antarctic art on display

A free public exhibition of paintings and photographs of the Norwegian Arctic and Antarctica called "Ice Counterpoint" will be on display from Jan. 7-May 31 at the FedEx Global Education Center on the UNC campus.

The mixed-media exhibition includes photography, videography and environmentalsound recordings by Brooks de Wetter-Smith, the James Gordon Hanes Distinguished Professor of music at UNC, and paintings by Carrboro artist Nerys Levy. The works were inspired by trips to Antarctica and the Norwegian Arctic in recent years. The FedEx Global Education Center is at the corner of McCauley and Pittsboro streets. The exhibit will be accompanied by a free public concert on Feb. 23 at 7 p.m.
