

Runner up: The Arboretum





Runner up: Indoor Sports (seriously, are you reading this General Assembly)?




Favorite intramural sport Winner: Soccer

Favorite male athlete Winner: P.J. Hairston, men's basketball





Favorite local band Winner: Mipso Trio


