

ECHHS teacher receives national math award

East Chapel Hill High School math teacher John Wilson III has been selected as a winner of the Edyth May Sliffe Award for Distinguished High School Mathematics Teaching by the Mathematical Association of America.

Wilson is one of 23 teachers selected from high schools across the United States and Canada. He was nominated by East Chapel Hill High students.

The Mathematical Association of America is a 28,000-member organization devoted to mathematics education at the college level. The Edyth May Sliffe Award program is designed to recognize and reward outstanding teachers for their efforts in the development of mathematical talents of high school students.

Teen drinking forum

The Chapel Hill-Carrboro City Schools PTSAs will host the fifth annual parent forum, "Should We Drink With Our Teens?" on Feb. 4 from 7 to 9 p.m. in the East Chapel Hill High School Auditorium.

The event will feature an hour of expert panelist presentations followed by an hour of Q&A. Panelists will discuss the latest research and data on teenage drinking, brain development, lowering the drinking age, the "European Myth," family counseling, the law and crisis counseling.

The event is co-sponsored by the PTSA organizations of Carrboro, East Chapel Hill and Chapel Hill high schools and is free and open to the public.

Read In Day

McDougle Elementary School will host an African-American Read In Day on Friday.

The event, sponsored by the National Council of Teachers of English, focuses on literacy and black literary culture. Lincoln Center administrators and other community members are expected to read to children at the school from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m.

She will be presented with a \$250 award at the organization's state conference in Raleigh in


