FIREFIGHTERS' ASSEMBLY March 13, 1967

Gentlemen, first off let me thank you for asking me to speak tonight to this Assembly. This is my first opportunity to appear before you in a formal setting. I was asked by numerous men within the Department to make this address and I accepted (maybe a little blindly at first, and a mite relunctly). I realized of course in so doing that I would be placed in a position that could be detremental to me and my career but after much thought, I realized that here could be a starting place for a worth while organization, so I agreed, but with one stipulation, that I not be censored in my prepared text. I will present to you a 10 point program of evaluations that may explain some of the needs that we all share in common. You are here tonight probably out of curosity:

In some circles, I will not nor will you be very popular, but truth must stand. So here is the program. 1. The Fire Department of the City of Charlotte has lost it's public image and has dropped from No. 1 in the public eye to the bettom of the tetem pole.

When the Fire Department is spoke of it is only by a few and for a few.

The firemen of the City of Charlotte are to blame. We have let this happen. This could be one of the reasons our salaries stay at this constant level while others increase. If we don't do something new, within 2 years we will be tied with the lowest paid employees in the City, believe it or not. The handwriting is on the wall.

- 2. The Charlotte Fire Department is in a state of fear.

 Each man fearing the other, not knowing who can speak and who cannot speak. You do not have to be told to keep your mouth shut, but the threat is there non the less.
- 3. We are not even allowed the basic right of free assembly, because of fear. This in itself can hinder men in the performance of their duties.
- 4. The Charlotte Fire Department is in dire need of more dedicated men and not just bodies. That walking encyclopedia will fail you when the going gets rough. It's good to have knowledge, but applying it is a matter of skill and dedication.
- 5. If you decided to stand up as men and form this organization, let it be said here and now; that this is not a head-hunter group, and that the intent of this is to better the Fire Department, so that we can give a just and honest accounting to the citizens who foot the bill.
