Some wine for your whine?

Clive Merrifield, 44, was just trying to have a romantic dinner with his girlfriend in an Indian restaurant when a baby at a nearby table began crying loudly. Merrifield suggested to Billy West, the baby's 20-year-old father, that the seven-month-old baby might be tired.

West reacted by taking a wine bottle from Merrifield's ice bucket and smashing it on Merrifield's head. Merrifield sustained a four-inch cut from the attack. West was arrested after being found hiding under a pile of clothes in a neighbor's bedroom. He was sentenced to two years and five months in jail.

Merrifield said the scar from the attack and 16 stitches makes him feel self-conscious at work and in public.
