Board to decide on budget changes

The Chapel Hill-Carrboro City Board of Education will review its budget plans at its Sept. 3 meeting at the Chapel Hill Town Hall in light of the fact that the recently passed budget includes discretionary reductions and state and local amendments.

The board also will be updated on the status of the Carrboro High School Arts Wing. After receiving an initial allocation of \$1,916,783.72 from the state, the district submitted another application for an additional \$2,660,516.28. If received, the additional money would complete the original project estimate. The board anticipates that it will find out if the money was rewarded in

mid-September, in time for it to be discussed at the Sept. 15 Orange County Board of Commissioners meeting.

The North Carolina Department of Transportation will request to use the drainage on the McDougle Middle School campus to facilitate the road and sidewalk improvements as part of its plan to widen Old Fayetteville Road and install sidewalks from the intersection at N.C. 54 north to McDougle. The NCDOT has offered \$600 as payment. The board will be asked to authorize this request Thursday night.

Also at the meeting, the board will adopt local guidelines concerning the Graduation Project or an alternative to it. The board also will reconsider the service learning requirement in light of its decision on the Graduation Project.

The Board of Education meeting is a 6 p.m. closed session.

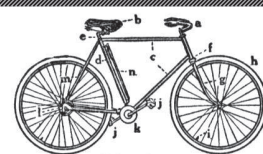
