**Ninety-four kids not enough for dad**

**T**he world's largest family shows no signs of slowing down. Religious leader Ziona Chana lives with his 39 wives and 94 children in a mansion in northeastern India.

The man's sons and their families all live in separate rooms in the 100-room mountain house. Chana's wives share a common dormitory.

The 66-year-old Chana heads a local Christian sect that allows polygamy. "Even today, I am ready to expand my family and willing to go to any extent to marry," he said.

The family consumes about 200 pounds of rice and about 130 pounds of potatoes each day.
