



Memorial Service at Morris Island in the Gullah/Geechee Nation

On Morris Island, hurricanes have leveled the site of the sand fort assaulted by the 54th Massachusetts on July 18, 1863, but bones of the brave men who fought on both sides that day still rest in the sand hills of the island where they were buried. The beach is nearly identical in appearance to what the men of the 54th would have seen that day and conditions on the Island are identical. Keepers of the Morris Island lighthouse reburied bones found on the eroding barrier island beach in the 1930's. Local relic hunters found such bones following Hurricane Hugo, showing the marks of bone saws from the Many soldiers were buried on the now eroded beach, but others were buried in the dunes of the Island. One man died for every yard of the Island taken by the Federal army in 1863. The Star of the West Battery was also located along this section of beach, from which Citadel Cadets fired and what some historians consider to be the first shots of the war against a Federal Supply Ship in January 1861.

God planned the ordaining and enstoolment that was held July 2, 2000. God planned that date to be when the Gullah/Geechee Nation would come God planned this to into existence. happen on Sullivan's Island where many of the ancestors of Gullah/ Geechees suffered, bleed, and died.

A plan that is made by God is one that MUST come to pass. It is only a person that may delay this plan, but the person has no power to stop the plan. So, as we enter the new cycle in the growth of the Gullah/Geechee Nation, the leaders of the Gullah/Geechee Nation came together as we have done since 2000 to pray for our people and to send forth energy to heal our land.

We prayed together and paid homage to our ancestors that were able to endure in spite of the brutality that they were faced with and that was used as mechanisms of psychological slavery. they were "clothed in their right before us. Disya da who wi da!

July 2nd is a major day of historical minds." Thus, they continued to hold their tear ducts had been emptied and they had their last nerve stepped on.

> They continued to pray for their children that would come later and they wanted us to have a better life than they had. They never anticipated that what we thought would be better would be to sell off our legacy-our land or our cultural traditions. They never thought that after all that they endured that their would be some that would later volunteer to be in servitude. Those of us that respect what they expected, honor them. We honor those that fought for freedom not just for their personal comfort, but for all of us. We honor our ancestors that unlike Denmark Vesey and Gullah Jack, they never had their names written down for us to recall them and call them out loud. By honoring them, we honor ourselves. We honor God.

So, as I began the date of the anniversary of my enstoolment, it began with me being awake at midnight working and praying. I pray that the Gullah/ Geechee Nation will always be filled with prosperity and that the land will be healed. A direct link to the continent of Africa exist in the Gullah/Geechee Nation which includes the Sea Islands that are a part of North and South Carolina, Georgia, and North Florida, Gullah/Geechee culture began during the enslavement of African people in North America. It is the amalgamation of numerous African cultures and traditions. Due to isolation on Sea Islands, the African people there did not have too much contact with people of other races except Native Americans. Thus, they were able to maintain their culture, language, and traditions unlike African people that were living on the "mainland." Gullah/Geechees transformed these into a new and distinct culture.

Queen Quet Marquetta L. Goodwine launched the "Gullah/Geechee Sea Island Coalition" on Saturday, December 21, 1996.

#### South Carolina Property Tax Installment Payments

The Gullah/Geechee Sea Island Coalition worked with the Concerned Citizens of the St. Helena Island and several other local organizations to have Beaufort County implement a quarterly tax payment plan. Although the Beaufort County Council voted unanimously to have this done, it has never been implemented. Senator Clementa Pinckney recently won the nomination for this coming November's elections) and other delegates of the SC General Assembly took this a step further by passing the South Carolina Property Tax Installment Law that now requires all counties of the state to put systems in place for prepayment of annual property taxes. People paying installment taxes in 2009 will have to pay the 2008 taxes as usual, as well as the installments due in 2009. Also, property owners must apply for the installment payment option. Otherwise, they must pay all of the taxes at once as they do currently. We feel that the installment plan will help decrease land lost in the Gullah/ Geechee Nation because it is easier for some people to pay a bill each month than it is to pay one large bill all at one time.


Applications for the installment plan will only be accepted from December 1, 2008 to January 15, 2009 for the 2009 tax year. Property covered will include land, houses, mobile homes, and business property only. Boats and escrow are not included.

The five installment payments must be made ON TIME on the 15th of February. April, June, August, and October. Any remaining balance must be paid no later than January 15. Taxpayers will be due interest on overpayments.

You must submit a written request for 2009 property tax installments in person at your county treasurer's office between December 1, 2008 and January 15, 2009. Yet, the South Carolina Hall of Fame has yet to realize that this native South Carolinian deserves a place on their list. His family continues to push for this and the Gullah/Geechee Nation is calling on everyone to support them in this effort.



James Jamerson was described by Motown founder Berry Gordy as "a genius on the bass...and incredible improviser in the studio and somebody I always wanted on my sessions."

### The Gullah/Geechee Nation Salutes the Robert Smalls Family

The United States Army has paid tribute to the legacy of the Gullah Statesman Robert Smalls by naming a vessel in their operational fleet after this great Civil War hero and SC state representative. Robert Smalls was born in Beaufort, SC, his mother Lydia had been born on Lady's Island, SC in the Gullah/Geechee Nation.

Robert Smalls is recognized in Beaufort and in Charleston due to the fact that he was rented out to be enslaved at the docks of Charleston. From

that port, he commandeered a Confederate vessel called "The Planter." He took it to Union waters and "the rest is history."

MG Robert Smalls into the Charleston Harbor came the spirit of Dolly Nash, great granddaughter of Robert Smalls and the rest of the Smalls' Family. Aboard were all those whose names were not written down in the books, but without whom, Robert Smalls would not have been such a noted leader in history.

Thus, with them present at the libation ceremony, this became "we storee!" As the blessings fell over all present for the ceremony and for all the crew of the ship that was on board and those to come, that same power extended out to the streets of Charleston and spirit of Robert Smalls walked the leaders of the Gullah/Geechee Nation back to Ansonborough and sat on the piazza. May his soul rest peacefully and may his name never be forgotten! Tenk Gawd fa disya Gullah/Geechee!

#### **GULLAH/GEECHEE IS ONE NATION!!!**



The Gullah/Geechee Nation has always honored both the Africans and the indigenous Americans of the Gullah/Geechee Nation. Many Gullah/Geechees have indigenous American ancestry due to the fact that their people intermarried on the islands as a means to learn to fight against their shared oppressor. Thus, as the indigenous peoples came together to become ONE NATION, the Gullah/Geechee Nation was asked to also sign the treaty with peoples from around the world.

SOMOS LOS MISMOS

The ONE NATION Treaty signing began

in April 2008 (see page 13 for more information). Numerous indigenous people conducted their own ceremonies during "The Longest Walk" (which was first conducted in 1978 and changed history for native people). Leaders of the Gullah/Geechee Nation joined the end of "The Longest Walk" on July 9, 2008 in Maryland and conducted their own ceremony and signed the treaty to show unity with this movement to "protect sacred sites and defend human rights."







Stanley & Eulalaine Perry (Navajos) placed the Gullah/Geechee flag on a traditional bamboo poll, wrapped it and tied it in a ribbon that held all the colors of the rainbow. The ribbon symbolized the unity of this event.

On hand for the dedication was United States Majority Whip, Congressman James E. Clyburn, town council members, and other guests.

As people go through the Town of Mount Pleasant, may they not see only the hands, but may they then go to and look into the eyes of those that continue to keep the sweetgrass tradition alive. May they listen to the words that they have to share and tune into the hearts of the people. May their hearts begin to beat in unison as one rhythm of freedom and continued existence for all Gullah/Geechees!!!

Numerous international connections and reconnections were made on this trip. They had the opportunity to take in some opportunities of fellowship after having a meeting and reception at the Barbados Embassy.


The "family reunion" with Mr. Bulbulia and the staff and friends of the Barbados Embassy proved to be a major historical opportunity to relink Gullah/Geechees with their kinspeople on the island of Barbados. In accordance with the African tradition from whence they stem and diplomatic protocol, gifts were presented to Queen Quet as she also left gifts from the Gullah/Geechee Nation for the consuls and staff of the Embassy.







#### FRUM DE ARCHIVE: Excerpt From: Frederick Douglas' Independence Day Address July 5, 1852



"Fellow-citizens, pardon me, allow me to ask, why am I called upon to speak here today? What have those or I I represent, to do with your national independence? Are the great principles of political freedom and of natural justice, embodied in that Declaration of Independence extended to us? And am I, therefore, called upon to bring our humble offering to the national altar, and to confess the benefits and express devout gratitude for the blessings resulting from your independence to us?

Would to God, both for your sakes and ours, that an affirmative answer could be truthfully returned to these questions. Then would my task be light and my burden easy and delightful. For who is there so cold, that a nation's sympathy could not warm him? Who so obdurate and dead to the claims of gratitude, that would not thankfully acknowledge such priceless benefits? Who so stolid and selfish, that would not give his voice to swell the hallelujahs of a nation's jubilee, when the chains of servitude had been torn from his limbs. I am not that man. In a case like that, the dumb might eloquently speak, and the "lame man leap as an hart."

But such is not the state of the case. I say it with a sad sense of the disparity between us. I am not included within the pale of this glorious anniversary! Your high independence only reveals the immeasurable distance between us. The blessings in which you, this day, rejoice are not enjoyed in common. You share the rich inheritance of justice, liberty, prosperity and independence, bequeathed by your fathers, not by me. The sunlight that brought light and healing to you has brought stripes and death to me. This Fourth July is yours, not mine. You may rejoice, I must mourn. To drag a man in fetters into the grand illuminated temple of liberty, and call upon him to join you in joyous anthems, were inhumane mockery and sacrilegious irony.

Do you mean, citizens, to mock me, by asking me to speak today? If so, there is a parallel in your conduct. And let me warn you that it is a dangerous to copy the example of a nation whose crimes, towering up to heaven, were thrown down by the breath of the Almighty, burying that nation in irrevocable ruin! I can today take up the plaintive lament of a peeled and woe-smitten people!

Would you have me argue that man is entitled to liberty? That he is the rightful owner of his own body? You have already declared it. Must I argue the wrongfulness of slavery? Is that a question for Republicans? Is it to be settled by the rules of logic and argumentation, as a matter beset with difficulty, involving a doubtful application of the principle of justice, hard to be understood? How should I look to-day, in the presence of Americans, dividing and subdividing a discourse, to show that men have a natural right to freedom? speaking of it relatively and positively, negatively and affirmatively. To do so, would be to make myself ridiculous, and to offer an insult to your understanding. - There is not a man beneath the canopy of heaven who does not know that slavery is wrong for him.

What, am I to argue that it is wrong to make men brutes, to rob them of their liberty, to work them without wages, to keep them ignorant of their relations to their fellow men, to beat them with sticks, to flay their flesh with the lash, to load their limbs with irons, to hunt them with dogs, to sell them at auction, to sunder their families, to knock out their teeth, to burn their flesh, to starve them into obedience and submission to their masters? Must I argue that a system thus marked with blood, stained with pollution, is wrong? No! I will not. I have better employment for my time and strength than such arguments would imply.

What then remains to be argued? Is it that slavery is not divine; that God did not establish it; that our doctors of divinity are mistaken? There is blasphemy in the thought. That which is inhuman, cannot be divine! Who can reason on such a proposition? They that can, may; I cannot. The time for such argument is past.

At a time like this, scorching irony, not convincing argument, is needed. O! had I the ability, and could I reach the nation's ear, I would to-day, pour out a fiery stream of biting ridicule, blasting reproach, withering sarcasm, and stern rebuke. For it is not light that is needed, but fire; it is not the gentle shower, but thunder. We need the storm, the whirlwind, and the earthquake. The feeling of the nation must be quickened; the conscience of the nation must be roused; the propriety of the nation must be startled; the hypocrisy of the nation must be exposed; and its crimes against God and man must be proclaimed and denounced.

What, to the American slave, is your 4th of July? I answer; a day that reveals to him, more than all other days of the year, the gross injustice and cruelty to which he is the constant victim.

To him, your celebration is a sham; your boasted liberty, an unholy license; your national greatness, swelling vanity, your sounds of rejoicing are empty and heartless; your denunciation of tyrants, brass fronted impudence; your shouts of liberty and equality, hollow mockery; your prayers and hymns, your sermons and thanksgivings, with all your religious parade and solemnity, are, to him mere bombast, fraud, deception, impiety, and hypocrisy - a thin veil to cover up crimes which would disgrace a nation of savages. There is not a nation on the earth guilty of practices more shocking and bloody than are the people of the United States, at this very hour.

Go where you may, search where you will, roam through all the monarchies and despotisms of the Old World, travel through South America, search out every abuse, and when you have found the last, lay your facts by the side of the every-day practices of this nation, and you will say with me, that, for revolting barbarity and shameless hypocrisy, America reigns without rival...

America is false to the past, false to the present, and solemnly binds herself to be false to the future. The great sin and shame of America!

"I will not equivocate; I will not excuse"; I will use the severest language I can command, everything that serves to perpetuate "White Supremacy - Racism"; and yet not one word shall escape that any man, whose judgment is not blinded by prejudice, or who is not at heart a Racist, shall not confess to be right and just.

#### INTERNATIONAL CONCEPT OF "THE ONE NATION" IN THE OFFING from May 8, 2008 Edition of "Wulustuk Times"

Hundreds of Indigenous Sovereign Nations who live and prosper in the traditional ways within the current borders of Canada, the United States, Australia, New Zealand, Fiji and the Caribbean have agreed to sign The Declaration of Sovereignty of The One Nation (being a Nation consisting of all Sovereign Indigenous Nations of the World), by which these Indigenous Sovereign Nations unite as ONE to re-assert their inherent sovereignty as ONE, inviting all other Indigenous Sovereign Nations from all around the world to join. This "happening" was foretold in the Prophesies thousands of years ago. On April 20, 2008, The Algonquin Nation from Northern Quebec held a sacred ceremony, at which time the traditional Elders signed the Declaration, thereby giving birth to The One Nation. The signing was done by the Algonquin to "light the torch" to be passed along to other Indigenous Sovereign



Nations. The Cree followed soon thereafter. The Mi'kmaq Nation is to follow up in June of 2008 with its own signing ceremony. Two (2) Choctaw Bands have also signed. Other Nations are welcome to hold their own ceremony in their own way in their own time to effectuate their own signing.

Otherwise, the next major gathering for the purpose of signing is currently scheduled to take place on July 8-9, 2008, at Greenbelt Park (campground) (301-344-3944) (174 campsites available), Maryland, 12 miles North of Washington, D.C., 2 days prior to the conclusion of The Longest Walk, when many Elders and Nations from around the world will be present. It is hoped that the Dalai Lama will also be present for this sacred event. The Australian and New Zealand Sovereign Indigenous Nations have now begin to effectuate their own signing across their sacred lands at their sacred "Dreamtime" sites. The torch will be passed across The Australian and New Zealand Continent at this time. This


signing may take a couple of months to be accomplished, but it will be accomplished.

As most of you know, on September 13, 2007, the United Nations' General Assembly approved the much touted United Nations' Declaration on The Rights of Indigenous Peoples (the "UN Declaration"). Although this UN Declaration, importantly, recognizes the right of our Nations to seek self-determination, it does not, in and of itself, take the next step to advance the cause of Indigenous Sovereign Nations around the world. The One Nation IS that next step, the necessary next step to lead us forward.

Again, those who know will understand that the traditional governing systems and the traditional cultures of these Indigenous Sovereign Nations were and continue to be decimated by laws enacted by their "host" countries, including Canada, the United States, Australia, New Zealand, Fiji, the Caribbean and numerous others, which laws, among other things, impose false (proxy) (foreign) governments and laws on our peoples, and force our Nations to bow before the colonizing courts to resolve inter-nation disputes with them. This Declaration of true Sovereignty has the blessing of the Creator, the one true Law.

The creation of The One Nation "immediately" frees the Indigenous Sovereign Nations to re-assert their sovereignty, an inherent sovereignty granted by the Creator to each human at birth, which was never surrendered and never could have been surrendered. It has taken the Indigenous Sovereign Nations over 200 years to regroup and arrive at this crucial point in history to re-commence performing their sacred duties to care for Mother Earth, all Her creatures, great and small (and, hence, all humans too). It is no accident and no coincidence that the Creator has chosen this time to arrange for the re-assertion of these ancient Nations. The air, the water, the land and all living things are in danger now as never before. The One Nation is born from all things positive, not from anger for past oppression and atrocities undeniably committed. These things are forgiven. When the colonizers arrived, as predicted in the Prophesies, our ancestors welcomed them and cared for them, as the Creator instructed, when they could not care for themselves. They were like children sitting at our feet in need of sustenance, which many of our ancestors gladly provided. The children grew up steadily over the course of several hundred years, only to rebel against their caregivers, reacting with greed and forgetfulness of all that was done for them and all that we tried to teach them, harming our Mother the Earth in the process. For this they must also be forgiven. The time has come, however, when these now young adults must realize and admit the error of their youthful and frivolous ways and turn once again to the wisdom and care of those who raised them. Unwittingly, they developed along the way the technological and linguistic means for all Indigenous Sovereign Nations to now join together with one good mind and one pure heart for the good of all humans. To keep in mind a message from Hereditary Chief Gary Metallic, Mi'Kmaq; "This Declaration must be signed by not only representing Chiefs but also by the elders, women, men, children who will validate the legitimacy of our new nationhood."

In conclusion, The One Nation extends an open invitation to all Indigenous Sovereign Nations to join on this historic and epic peaceful path into the future and also to convey this all-important message to all colonizing states: "The One Nation extends, once again, its open hand in friendship and in good faith as our gesture of our desire to continue to coexist for the benefit and respect of all living creatures and our one true Mother, the Earth herself."
