Senate, House divided as costs mount in Libya mission

WASHINGTON, D.C. (MCT) — Key senators on Tuesday urged giving the White House authority for a one-year, limited Libya mission, but sentiment was growing in the House of Representatives to cut off the effort's funding. Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid, D-Nev., said the Senate probably could pass the measure, though he offered no timetable. Discussions were under way on possible House action, including denying funds for the operation as part of a defense-spending bill that's expected to be considered beginning Thursday. The White House has said the U.S. has spent \$716 million through June 3 on the Libya campaign, and it estimates the mission will cost \$1.1 billion by Sept. 30.

Ahmadinejad faces threats of impeachment from elites

BEIRUT (MCT) — In another blow to Iranian President Mahmoud Ahmadinejad, a controversial deputy foreign minister allied with Ahmadinejad's increasingly embattled and isolated clique resigned Tuesday under pressure from hard-liners who threatened to impeach the

country's top diplomat over the appointment. Mohammad Sharif Malekzadeh, an ally of Ahmadinejad, resigned from his post as deputy foreign minister for administrative and financial affairs after drawing fire over allegations of criminal activity. Ahmadinejad, a populist firebrand and international lightning rod who is approaching the constitutionally mandated end in 2013 of his second and final term, finds himself with increasingly little room to maneuver as he jostles for power against other powerful factions within Iran's political elite.

Huntsman launches GOP campaign to the left of field

JERSEY CITY, N.J. (MCT) — Jon Huntsman Jr. ceremonially launched his presidential campaign Tuesday with the Statue of Liberty as his iconic backdrop. But more telling was what figuratively stood to the Republican's right: the rest of the GOP's 2012 field. Huntsman's long-shot candidacy rests, in large part, on a gamble about positioning. Utah's former governor and President Barack Obama's former China ambassador has staked out the turf to the left of the other GOP candidates, a move that could help him were he to win his party's nomination but may well

prevent him from getting it. Huntsman, 51, is waging what he says will be a different sort of campaign. An expensively produced campaign video, used to introduce him to a small invited crowd of friends and supporters, borrowed Obama imagery by describing Huntsman as a "no drama" politician — in contrast to his often-combative and partisan competitors.

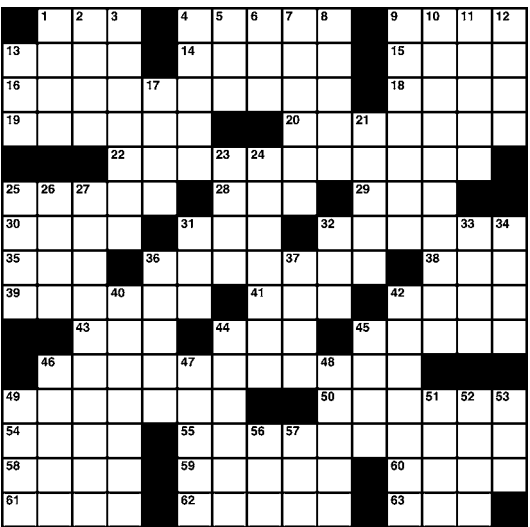
