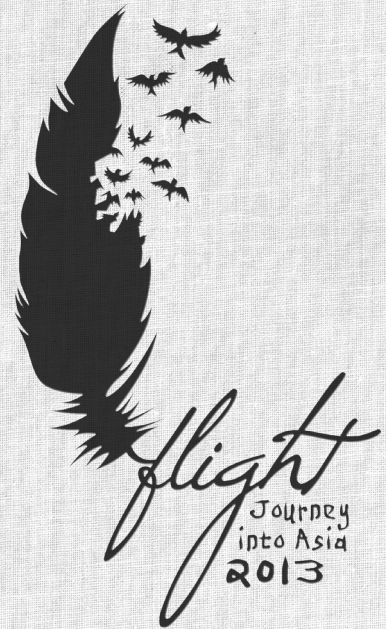


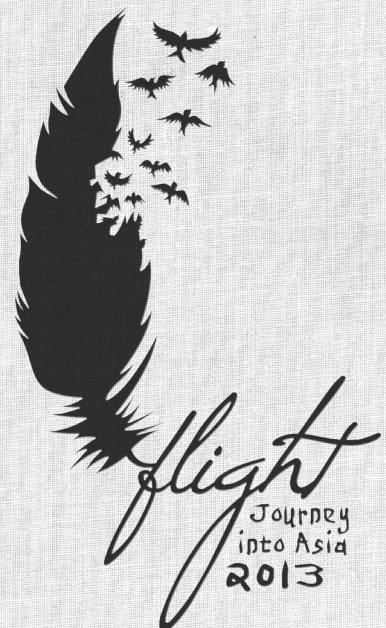

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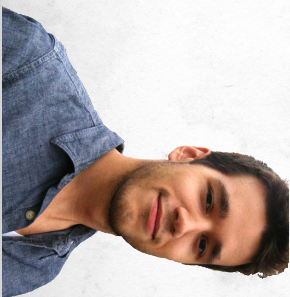
MASTER OF CEREMONIES

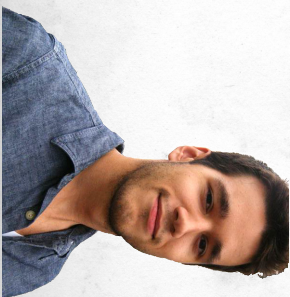

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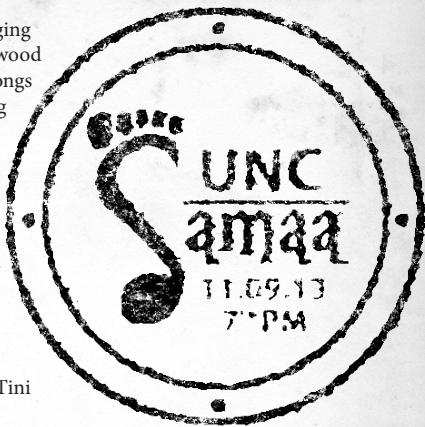
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SAMAA

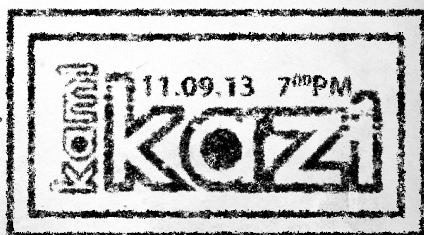

KAMIKAZI

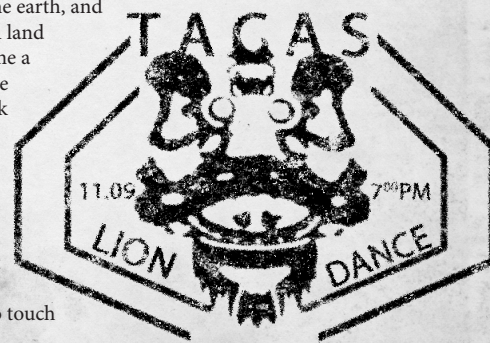

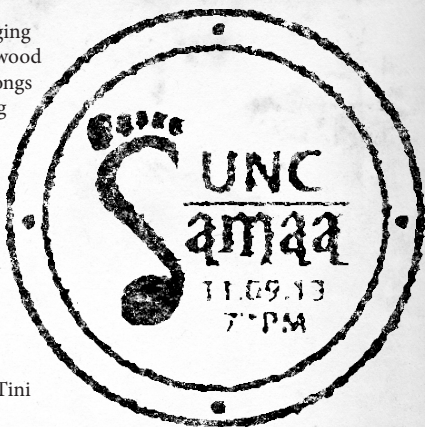


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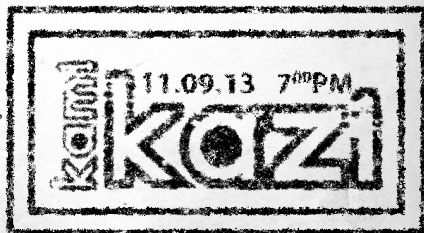
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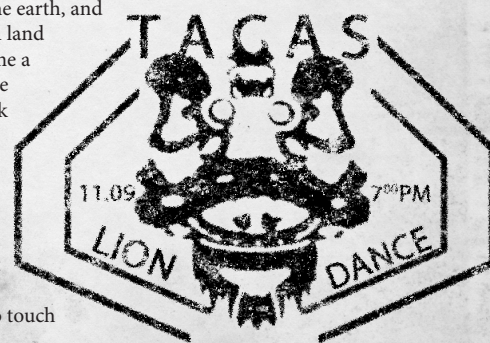
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FLYING SILK CHINESE DANCE TROUPE

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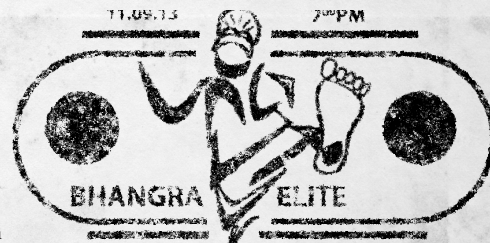
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BHANGRA ELITE

KOREAN FAN DANCE FAIRIES

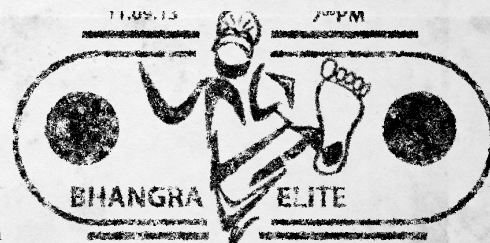

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MOONLIGHT DANCE CREW

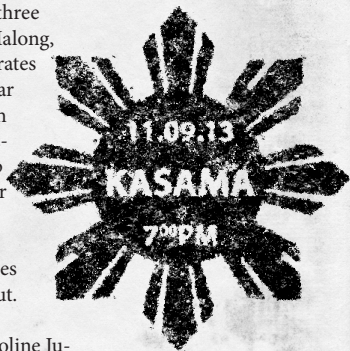

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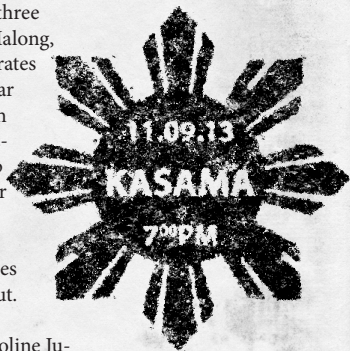
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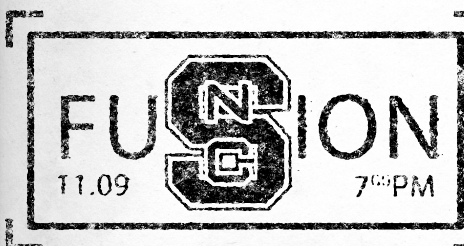


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ALPHA KAPPA DELTA PHI
