

Four faces missing from UNC's faculty this fall

UNC prides itself on its high-quality educational standards and engaged student body. This would make it a dream location for professors and lecturers, but faculty retention has been an issue for the University, as some of the top professors in their respective fields have been lured away.

On average, between the 2004-05 academic year and the 2007-08 academic year, about 41 faculty members received offers from outside universities every year.

Between the 2009-10 academic year and the 2012-13 academic year, that number grew 112 percent to an average of 87 professors receiving outside offers each year.
