My dear Miss McDevitt:


I take pleasure in informing you that you have been nominated and appointed as Teaching Fellow in Mathematics for the year 1944-1945. The stipend of the Fellowship is \$600.00, payable in nine monthly instalments. Also, a service scholarship is awarded which covers tuition charges.
