In the complaint filed against Andrew Phillips, Chairman of the Elections Board, the Plaintiffs attempted to demonstrate standing based on Title III, Section 409.B. This section of the Code states that a student can establish standing if he or she is “directly and adversely affected by a regulation, ruling, or determination of the Elections Board.” While Plaintiffs cited the appropriate portion of the Code, they failed to explain, in any detail, how they have been directly and adversely affected. Therefore, all four constituent members of the Plaintiff have did not demonstrate their standing to bring an action against Chair Phillips before the Student Supreme Court. As such, the Defendant moves to dismiss the case against Chair Phillips on the grounds that the Plaintiff has failed to establish standing for an election action in accordance with Title III, Section 409.B.
