<u>Guidebook to North Carolina's Historic Architecture Planned</u> A grant of \$55,000 from the National Endowment for the Humanities to the Federation of N.C. Historical Societies will help fund the production of the guidebook by the Survey and Planning Branch of the N.C. Division of Archives and History with the assistance of the national Society of Architectural Historians (SAH). The SAH has initiated a national series of state volumes to be called "The Building of the United States" and has encouraged North Carolina to participate as one of the pilot state projects. Work is expected to begin early this year and to be completed in late 1985.

U.N.C. Press, 1983 -(5 hardback volumes) is available in our local library. This series of books was produced under the direction of the N.C. Division of Archives and History and is very well done with many new and old illustrations. The first volume entitled <u>Natives</u> and <u>Newcomers</u> (pre-1770) is especially interesting in its description of how the state was settled.
