Ross's announcement that schools could see up to a 15 percent cut, or a \$405 million reduction in funding.

Though the students' discussions with legislators might not result in more funding, that's not necessarily the goal of the Students Day at Congress event, said Arjay Quizon, student body president of UNC-Pembroke.

"We could write letters to the legislators about our priorities if that was the most important part of today," Quizon said.

"The mere fact that we students went out of our way sends a message that we're really serious about what we're asking for."

Showing up in person also puts faces to the issue of university funding, said Deanna Santoro, the associate vice president of legislative public affairs for ASG.

"What's important about today is being able to make those personal connections," Santoro said.

"Legislators often forget what it means to be a student and when they sit down and talk with us, it sometimes enlightens them and makes them re-prioritize what's important."

The financial impact of the day remains to be seen, but at the least legislators were reminded of what's important to students in this state, said ASG President Atul Bhula.

"We made the case that education in general is what North Carolina prides itself on, that's what's important," he said.

while maintaining public access.

"Poverty is very real and we can't be responsible, as a legal institution, for criminalizing that poverty," she said.

DPS spokesman Randy Young said students' safety and comfort is the department's first priority.

"If there are folks that are harassing or approaching students and displaying suspicious behavior, we ask that students let us know and we will investigate," Young said.

"We really do need to take advantage of students, staff and faculty being our eyes and ears in these situations."

Campus police responded to a complaint on Feb. 3 that a man was acting suspiciously in the Kathrine R. Everett Law Library.

Police questioned Mark Johnson and discovered that there were multiple outstanding warrants for his arrest in counties across the state.

Johnson was arrested and detained in Orange County Jail on Feb. 3. The next day, campus police responded to another report of sus-

picious activity at the school.

to cap out-of-state enrollment for freshman classes at 18 percent.

The fall 2010 enrollment report showed that UNC-CH went beyond the cap for the second consecutive year.

Universities have been coordinating with local police departments for the past two years to extend their law enforcement jurisdiction.

The board will be discussing that initiative and others related to campus safety.

Members of the budget and finance committee will review the

results of two studies that looked at the rising cost of textbooks and the impact of programs, such as rental and guaranteed buyback, that have reduced the financial burden on students.


