Man jailed after cell phone rings

An unfortunately timed phone call has landed someone in jail. The man was sitting in a Kentucky courtroom when the circuit judge instructed attendants to turn off their phones or they would be placed behind bars. Less than a minute after the threat, the man's phone rang, resulting in a 72-hour jail sentence.

Judge Dennis Foust said he has had to confiscate ringing cell phones in the past, prompting him to issue the more severe threat.

"If I say I'm going to do something, then I don't do it, it has no effect whatsoever," he said.

Judges can determine their own protocol for cell phone usage, he said.



