Dear Members,

The first two months of this year have been very busy for the board and many committees alike as we dove deep into the operations side to better understand and manage the day to day administrative, financial, bookkeeping and accounting tasks to ensure the services and support to the temple and hall facility, staff as well as to our members were uninterrupted and programs went on as planned. We are happy to report you that the transition was managed smoothly and the 2017 team is fully running the operations and already has started making some improvements. Many of you have reached out to us and offered help and shared your wisdom. We are ever thankful for that and will call upon you as and when needed.

For any organization to be efficient, whether religious or otherwise, it need minimum of these Five P's – Place, People, Processes, (consistent) Policies and Productivity to establish good governance and operational model. We are reasonably covered in first two P's – Place and People - but have lot more work to do on rest as evidenced during the transition and first two months of work. To this effect, the 2017 team has already started making the in-road. Our focus is to provide charter to all committees, job scope with roles and responsibilities to our employees, have consistent processes and fair policies keeping **HSNC FIRST** as well as look for opportunities to automate/streamline tasks to improve productivity. We believe such standardization and "play by the rules" with HSNC FIRST is the right approach to maintain consistency with regularity in serving members and affiliates and avoid churns. However, in order to succeed in our efforts to implement and execute such governance we need your help, understanding, encouragement and support – hope we can count on you.

During first two months, we have been able to achieve a few very important tasks, such as sending weekly HSNC emails on program/event, forming various committees, closing a loan for the learning center, providing charters to core committees, continue enhancing the website, mailing donation letters, enabling on-line registration process for Yogathon as well as Summer Camps, completing and implementing Rental Policy for main hall and learning center rooms. We were also able to organize various religious events – Havan on New Year day with a weeklong Ram Katha, "Pongal", "Lohri", and "Tyagaraja Aaradhana" covering north to south, and finished with "Mahashivaratri" celebration with Abhishekam attended by over 3500 devotees from morning to midnight on Feb 24th. We thank our Religious Committee and volunteers for a great job done in planning and managing this event as well as preparing and serving "Prasad" to all attendees. Additionally, we were able to organize couple of community events – Immigration info session on H1B/H4B/L1B visa by Mr. Murali attended by 300+ people and very enlightening lecture on "Science of Consciousness" by Dr. Subhash Kak.

2017 Grievance Committee has completed investigation into election complaint from a member, and have provided final report.

Sports and fitness activities are a way to engage youth and young professionals with our Temple. This year, we are launching "My HSNC, My Temple - Make the Connection" initiative and plan to organize Walk-a-Thon, Golf Tournament, Volleyball Tournament and 1st time HSNC Youth Basketball Tournament. The Learning Center construction committee along with Manoj Pandya continues to drive hard with the contractors to finish the last few things to get Certification of Occupancy (CO). We plan to have a grand opening with puja and cultural program on Saturday April 1 and Sunday April 2.

Spiritual Corner

Religion and Spirituality

Before we proceed to more topics of Bhagavad Gita let us focus on the role of religion and spirituality in our daily life. This topic will be quite useful for the Youth with science education and more exposure to the western way of life. Because of their less exposure to religion in general, they do not understand or recognize its importance. Dr. Radhakrishnan former President of India and a great scholar and philosopher explained the distinction between science and religion with this profound statement: *"A little knowledge of science will take us away from religion and a deeper knowledge of science will take us back deep into religion!"* A similar statement can be made with respect to religion and spirituality: *"A little knowledge of religion will take us away from spirituality and a deeper knowledge of religion will take us back deep into spirituality!"*

The term spirituality or being spiritual is being used quite frequently but those who claim to be spiritual may have different perceptions. Traditionally being spiritual implies to have an attachment to religious values, or matters of the spirit, rather than material or worldly interests. Spirituality is a broader concept with room for many perspectives. In general, it includes a sense of connection to something bigger than us and it typically involves a search for meaningful life. As such, it is a universal human experience—something that touches us all. People may describe a spiritual experience as *sacred* or *transcendent* or simply a deep sense of interconnectedness. Some may find that their spiritual life is intricately linked to their association with a church, temple, mosque, or synagogue. Others may pray or find comfort in a personal relationship with God or a higher power. Still others seek meaning through their connections to nature or art. Our sense of purpose of living implicitly defines our spirituality and as such it can change throughout our life. For spiritual progress, age can be a factor but age alone is responsible for spiritual progress. Spiritual way of thinking will change our attitude entirely and establish friendly relationship with the world instead of one of hostility as envisaged by materialism or secularism. This has been illustrated by lives of the ancient Hindu sages and saints.

Those who practice spirituality will seek the happiness that is three dimensional: (1) bring happiness to the seeker; (2) keep that happiness forever (eternal); and make sure that happiness pervades everyone across the universe (universal happiness). This is the fundamental requirement for practicing Sanatana Dharma. Sanatana Dharma keeps spirituality in the front with religion in the background. It is a code of ethics, a way of living through which one may achieve happiness in and around forever. Sanatana Dharma represents much more than just a **religion**; rather, it provides an entire worldview, a way of life coherent and rational. In contrast in the Western way of life, religion is put in the front and spirituality is kept in the background. Through faithful practice of their religion, the westerners gain the wisdom to know their role in the society which will help them to grow spiritually. Fundamentally we should recognize the fact that there are various levels of spirituality and we need to find the necessary level for optimal social behavior. What is the necessary level of spirituality that one has to undertake requires much a deeper study of religious scriptures such as the Bhagavad Gita.

Sanatana Dharma is the solemn pledge to lead a harmonious life without disturbing peace in the nature! It requires practitioners to respect and sustain their environment and consider it as a part of their own soul. As followers of Sanatana Dharma, we want to make sure to have a life style that ensures the eternal characteristics of the Nature. The word Dharma could be equated to religion but it is much more than just the religion. Suppose if we pose the question: – What is your Dharma? The answers will vary: some will say that my dharma is to worship my ishtadevata (s); some will say that I don't believe in God; some will say that I don't know whether there is God but my life is guided by my conscience; some will say that God is the guiding force for my life; some will say that my life is guided by the moral values that I gathered from the role-model characters of Epics, Puranas; and so on.

Defining the western concept of religion is loaded with difficulties because it is understood differently. A general understanding of religion is the belief in and worship of a superhuman controlling power, especially a personal God or gods. A very narrow view can be summarized with the following statement – "By religion I mean Christianity, by Christianity I mean Protestantism, by Protestantism I mean the *Church of England* as established by law." (Henry Fielding's novel, "Tom Jones." http://www.religioustolerance.org/rel_defn1.htm) Such narrow definition of religion tends to exclude other religions and beliefs and that may explain why the westerners have poorly understood the eastern religions. Sanatana Dharma accommodates all beliefs and recognizes the theological, philosophical, anthropological, sociological and psychological aspects of human kind.

In conclusion, spirituality goes beyond all boundaries to attain bliss - the ultimate happiness. This happiness should meet three criteria: First, we should be happy; second everyone around us is also happy; and most importantly the happiness is sustained for a long time (permanent). In other words, when we reach the highest state of spiritual awakening the happiness (bliss) extends to go beyond space and time.

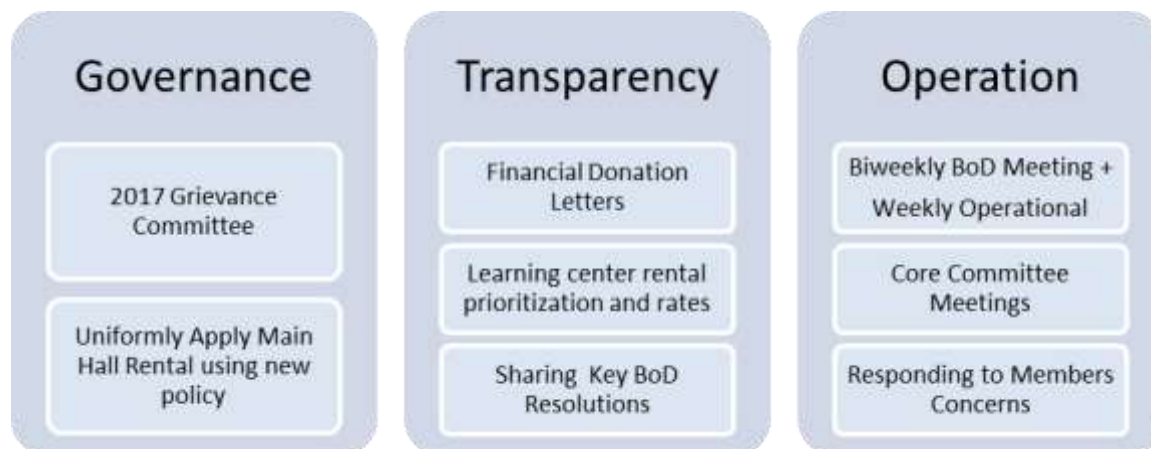

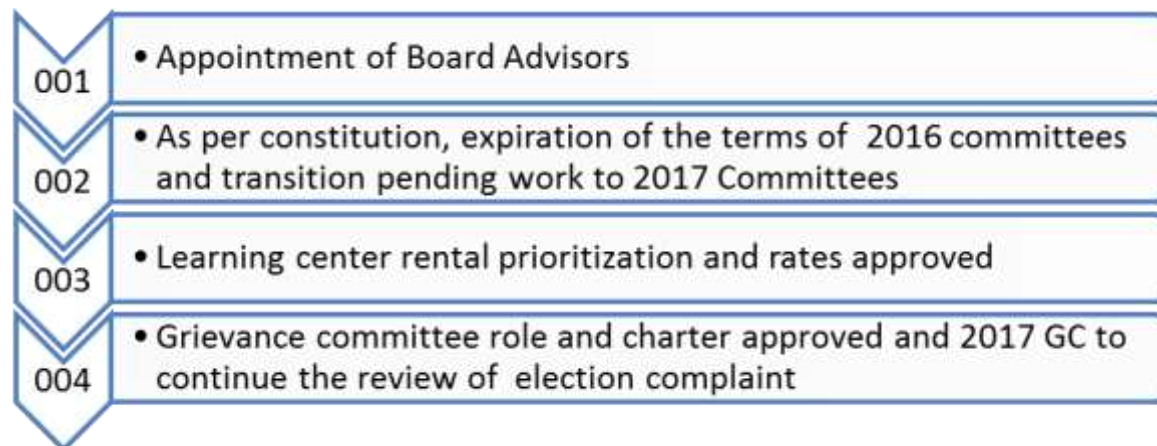
