Have you ever thought that your writing could be featured in a magazine? Or that you would be on the radio or TV? We would love to hear from you!



## Owning a Pet in New Bern

What do you do when you run across a lost dog or cat?

I called Trinity Smith, Director of the Craven/Pamlico Animal Services Center, to find out more about their shelter. I asked what people should do if they came across a lost dog or cat and she said, "Residents of Craven County that find a stray animal are encouraged to bring the animal to our facility or request an animal control officer pick it up. At the very least, finders should call us with a description of the animal. Owners of lost animals looking for their pets will come to us first. We maintain a lost/found log and have been able to reunite many animals with their owners."

Although over 4,500 animals come through the doors, they do their best to find the owners and/or find new owners by partnering with local rescue groups. If you're looking for a purebred animal, you may find one at the shelter as "Owner surrenders are one of the main reasons our intake numbers are as high as they are. People will acquire an animal and for whatever reason (moving, divorce, deployment, no time, finances, etc) fail to follow through on the commitment."

"Owning an animal is not a decision to be made lightly. Animals require time and money, and unfortunately, many people do not thoroughly consider this prior to bringing an animal into their home. You can help decrease the population of unwanted pets. Trinity said, "Spay/Neuter is crucial to limiting our intake numbers". If you want to help these animals, they are always in need of volunteers! Trinity Smith said, "Our volunteers fill a variety of roles, from bathing/grooming dogs, to photographing and uploading pictures online, to socializing kittens. We strongly value our volunteers and couldn't do what we do without them! Transport of animals to rescue groups is always needed!"

They "gladly accept donations, both monetary and gently used items. Monetary donations are tax deductible and used to: purchase vaccines/medication, enrichment items, and to provide veterinary care for the animals". They also "accept donations of gently used pet items, as well. Crates, bowls, collars/leashes, bedding, litter pans, grooming items, blankets and towels."

They offer microchipping and rabies vaccinations, for \$10 each. Trinity said, "We also have a spay/neuter program for qualifying low income residents". For more information, call 252-637-4606.

Fishing light and slow will increase your numbers. 1/16 and 1/8 weighted jig heads and weedless bass hooks with a variety of soft body shapes from DOA have produced very well, along with suspending hard baits. 10 pound braid and light action rods have also improve our catches. Striper fishing has been good I the New Bern area on deep ledges and hard structure. Soft plastics, again have been our best producer. Fly fishing for specks and stripers has also been excellent. 




