It is the candidate's responsibility to relay this information to all of his/her campaign staff and their designees:

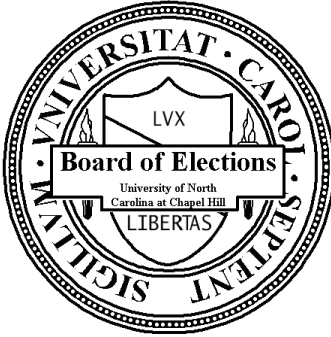
Access to the residence halls for the purpose of door-to-door canvassing and campaigning in the common lobby area happens from 7 to 9 pm on Sunday through Thursday over a three week span starting with the release of petition forms to students declaring their intent to run for SBP.

The Board of Elections has designed a "Non-Solicitation Notice" that it will distribute to students via its website and advertised through other means of promotion that students who live in campus housing will be allowed to print and stick to their doors. This sign will display the fact that the residents of the room do not, want to be solicited by a campaign member or a candidate. Violators of this posting should be reported to the Board of Elections.

For the process of access to the residence hall lobby and door-to-door canvassing, the "revised" system will be run out of the Community Offices that serve individual residence halls. Any campaign worker assigned to participate in door-to-door canvassing on a given night will be able to, starting at 6:50 pm, go to the Community Office that serves the residence hall they wish to enter and sign-in as a guest to campaign in a specific residence hall for a given campaign. The student shall be required to show his or her one card and the Office Assistant will document the request and issue proximity key access as necessary. The Office Assistant should keep track of what residence hall the person(s) will be campaigning in, what campaign they are representing, and keep track of how many other students from that same campaign have signed up for that same campus housing community. Only 10 people from the same campaign shall be permitted to have access to a campus housing community at one time. However, there shall be no restriction on how many campaigns can have access to a campus housing community at one time. The list of which campaigns are in a certain campus housing community will be available at the Community Office so as to encourage campaigns not to overlap excessively. The campaign worker(s) issued the flex pass must return the flex pass to the Community Office. If the flex pass is lost or damaged the respective campaign will be responsible for reimbursement, but the expense will not be counted as a campaign expenditure.

Please Note:

1. Door-to-Door campaigning is prohibited for Senior Class Candidates.
2. During the *spring* elections candidates will be allowed to go door-to-door Sunday - Thursday from 7 - 9 p.m.
3. You are not allowed to slide items under doors or post anywhere other than designated spaces.

Bulletin Board Posting Guidelines

In an effort to minimize the confusion of where campaign posters can be posted, the Department of Housing and Residential Education has designated **one bulletin board per residence hall** specifically for campaign posting. Those bulletin boards will be the only place where campaign posters are to be posted. Any others found posted in the residence halls will be taken down and held at the Community Office. We will ask the cooperation of our staff in not damaging or throwing away any of the posters they remove.

To post campaign materials, bring copies to the Housing and Residential Education office located in the basement level of Avery Residence Hall. Please plan ahead and allow at least 24 hours during the business week (Monday-Friday) for the materials to be posted. Flyers provided for posting will be placed at the following locations:
