What is an abolitionist? In order to better understand slavery, this is important.

Abolitionist: an individual who wanted to abolish, or get rid of, slavery.

Additional vocabulary to record:

Slave- a person who is treated as property owned by another person and made to work without pay.

Secede- to withdraw from the Union.

Union- another name for the United States; at the time of the Civil War, they were the states opposed to secession.

Confederacy- the states that seceded from the Union.
