The Paul Green Foundation is custodian of hundreds of photos from Paul Green's life: literary friends, WWI service, Hollywood years, world travel as a UNESCO representative for President Truman, family photos, Green's former homes and cabins and barns where he wrote. We hope to pass these photos on to the Southern Historical Collection at UNC – the repository of the Paul Green Papers – so we needed to find out what all we had!


Richard Wright and **Paul Green** at work on the stage play of *Native Son* in


1940-41 at UNC. The association between a Black writer and a White writer, in those days,
