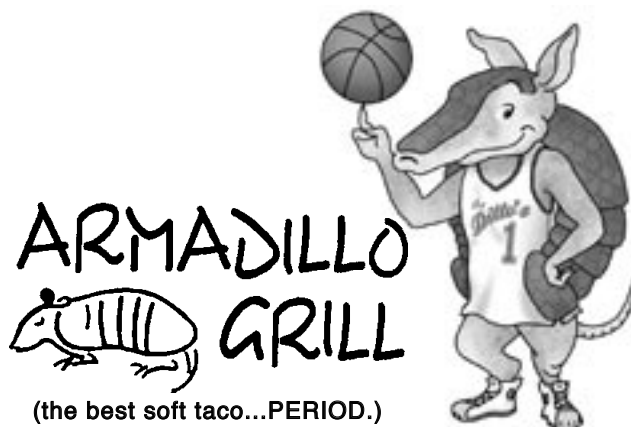
Favorite male athlete Winner: Tyler Zeller
