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Quirkiest roommate habit Winner: Culturing yogurt under a lamp



The milk is first heated to about 80 $^{\circ}$ C (176 $^{\circ}$ F) to kill any undesirable bacteria and to denature the milk proteins so that they set together rather than form curds. The milk is then cooled to about 45 $^{\circ}$ C (112 $^{\circ}$ F). The bacteria culture is added, and the temperature is maintained for 4 to 7 hours to allow fermentation.

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


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





Must-take class Winner: WMST 101

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






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Best male to female ratio Winner: "This is really sexist and gross."

Best theme night Winner: Country Night at East End Martini Bar


Finally the Scene is breaking out of the 80s or 90s nights. And East End is a full-service restaurant now. Good move.

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
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
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
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













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Favorite Carolina sports moment Winner: Winning the 2009 Men's **Basketball Championship**


Favorite intramural sport Winner: Soccer

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
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Best place to live Winner: Chapel Ridge










Best burger Winner: Buns


